Terms & Conditions for electronic access. 'Print & Electronic' Subscriptions

These Terms & Conditions allow simultaneous access to the electronic version of Scholarly Communications Report (SCR) by authorised users (Authorised Users) at the site of the 'Print & Electronic' subscriber (the Subscriber), identified by the Subscriber's relevant IP addresses representing a local network at the Subscriber's site.

Authorised Users are employees, students and academic staff employed by the Subscriber, at the site of the Subscriber. Authorised Users may also include users from the general public who are permitted by the Subscriber to access SCR from designated terminals within the Subscriber's site. Remote access by Authorised Users via the Subscriber's network is permitted. Authorised Users will be identified and authenticated by the use of IP (Internet Protocol) addresses provided by the Subscriber to SCR Publishing Ltd (The Publisher).

Authorised Users are permitted online access to SCR to which they hold or held a valid subscription. They will have the right to:

- electronically display SCR.
- download and digitally copy a reasonable portion of SCR.
- print a reasonable portion of SCR.
- transmit to a third party colleague in hard copy or electronically, minimal amounts of SCR for personal use or professional, research, scholarly or educational use but not for re-sale.
- use with appropriate credit, brief excerpts from SCR in their own professional or scholarly works.

Authorised Users are not permitted to:

- systematically download, copy, recompile, redistribute, re-publish SCR content.
- transmit the electronic version of SCR to non-subscribers.
- print or compile SCR content for fee-paying services.
- download substantial parts of SCR content for archive purposes.

The Subscriber shall take reasonable steps to prevent unauthorised use and to ensure that there is no unauthorised access, and to correct in a reasonable time any violations that have been brought to the Subscriber's attention by written notification from the Publisher.

The Subscriber is permitted to continue to have access, via the Publisher's own online provider site, subject to proper registration of the Subscriber's IP address or range of IP addresses, to the volumes for which subscriptions had been paid.

The Publisher shall use reasonable efforts to make SCR available in a timely manner, to provide continuous service and to ensure that the online content is at least as complete as the print version of SCR.

The Publisher reserves the right to withdraw from SCR any item or part of an item for which it has reasonable grounds to believe infringes copyright or is defamatory, obscene or unlawful. Copyright in SCR is vested in the Publisher and the Subscriber will not have any proprietary rights over the content.
